Anointed to Prophecy: How to Hear and Declare the Word of the Lord with Confidence

Prophets Bill Hamon, Chuck Pierce and Barbara Yoder

You will be taught how to hear and declare the Word of God and operate in the prophetic. Impartation, training and activation will release you to use your spiritual gifts - to Prophecy - for more effective ministry and to enhance your professional life. Daniel, Joseph and Apostle Paul used their prophetic gift to work with government and business leaders to preserve nations and to provide solutions. God declares that He will tell His prophets His will for mediation and declaration. After this course, the promise that: "You will prophesy, dream dreams and see visions" will become a reality.

Biblical Interpretation: Hermeneutics

Dr. William J. Hurst

Over the years, much has been written concerning the proper dispensation of truth. Hermeneutics is the theory of text interpretation, especially the interpretation of biblical texts, wisdom literature, and philosophical texts. The terms hermeneutics and exegesis are sometimes used interchangeably. Hermeneutics is a wider discipline that includes written, verbal, and nonverbal communication. Often in an attempt to be scientific in the interpretation of the Bible, the unique application of relationship with the author, the Holy Spirit is neglected. Also the special giftings of God both of spiritual gifts and ministry giftings are never factored into the interpretation. In this course all these factors plus other spiritual applications are considered. We expect the Holy Spirit to show up in the class.

Christology: The Life of Christ

In this course we will start in eternity past and move through the whole expression of the Son of God to eternity future. While studying the Life of Christ from this perspective we will discover truths that will cause of to meditate upon the vastness of the Love of God for us, and His purpose in redemption. All of His titles will be referenced in order that we understand just how great He is. Remember that one of the aspects of who He is was seen by John in the Book of revelation is He Who is, Who was and Who is to come. Until we understand, to some extent, these revelations of Jesus, we really will not be set so He can reveal himself to us. This is because we limit the Holy One of Israel in our lives to one of those time slots. Come study with us, and have your vision of who He is enlarged. It is our goal in this course to cause you to see Jesus magnified and the center of God's plan and purpose for the past, present and future.



Christian Foundation and Doctrine

Whenever we hear the word of truth, the good news of our salvation, believe it and are sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, the journey has only just begun. The next step is to be nurtured into living like disciples and this requires knowledge of what we believe.

Like newborn babies' new believers must now long for the pure milk of the word, that by it growth may take place in respect to salvation. We must know what we should be and could be. Whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction that through perseverance and the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope Romans 15:4 (New American Standard Bible). The gospel of the kingdom has been documented in both the old and new Testaments for a reason, so that Christians may know the truth and be free to live according to God's plan and purpose.

It is recorded in the New Testament that "16 Every scripture is God-breathed-given by His inspiration-and profitable for instruction, for reproof and conviction of sin, for correction or error and discipline in obedience, and for training in righteousness [that is holy living, in conformity to God's will in thought, purpose and action], 17so that the man of God may be complete and proficient, well fitted and thoroughly equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (Amplified Bible). However, within the scriptures there are some core components (doctrines) that every believer needs to know, understand and obey. It is for this reason that this study has been done.

This study includes but is not limited to, knowledge of salvation, the Kingdom of God the father, Jesus Christ our King, prosperity for all seasons, and the Holy Spirit Comforter.

Course Objectives

This course aims to:

- A. Educate the believer on some of the core doctrines of the Bible
- B. Examine the content of each doctrine and how it should impact our lives individually and corporately.
- C. Explain the purpose of each doctrine as it relates to the Kingdom of God.
- D. Apply the knowledge of each doctrine to daily living.

Communion with God – From the frame work of the Lord's Supper

In today's busy world with so many demands placed upon our time, most of them requiring immediate attention, taking time for devoted communion with one another is being practiced less and less. So, it is with our communion with God. Yet, Jesus' last act with His disciples on the night before He was crucified was the act of Communion.

This course will take students on an exciting discovery of the embodiment of the last act of communion Jesus Christ had with His disciples. Some scholars refer to this communion as the greatest inheritance one can imagine. This ordinance is so important to the body of Christ that Jesus asked that as often as we carry out this act, we must remember Him. You will tap in to our LORD's heart's cry as we spend time re-establishing the value and importance of communion with



God – The Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit and with one another to experience a place of intimacy with God.

Evangelism

Dr. Sheela Duraisami

In this course, we will look at the mandate, the purpose, the methods and the tools of evangelism. We will look at God's heart and purpose behind evangelism. Then we will learn about issues that stop people from evangelizing and whether everyone is called to be an evangelist. What part does the individual personality and diverse giftings come into the scene where evangelism is concerned? We will also look at the mindsets and methods of the past that have become ineffective now and learn new creative ways of Evangelism.

This course will bring about a paradigm shift in your mind, a passion and burden for souls in your heart and will propel you into a lifestyle of evangelism. By the end of the course, you will be equipped to strategically win souls into the Kingdom.

Genesis

Dr. Herbert Sutherland

Genesis is a course that will provide an introduction and overview to the first book of the Bible. Special focus will be placed on creation, the fall of man, the institution of marriage and on the six principal characters in the book: Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph.

We will examine the influence of each man on human history and his role in God's plan of salvation for mankind. This study will also include an analysis of critical and valuable theological issues as specified in the text of the book and a practical application of these truths to our Christian life

Harmony of the Gospels

This course will examine the four canonical gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John from historical, literary, cultural, theological and kingdom perspectives. It will examine the unique perspectives and contributions of each of these gospels, as well as the significant elements and themes they share in common.

This course builds upon the basics of New Testament Survey a deeper understanding of both the unity and the diversity which make up the "Full Gospel". It is concerned with details of organization, harmonization, parallelisms, supplements, chronology, geography, characters, doctrine, etc. The emphasis is on the person and work of Christ.

PURPOSE OF THE COURSE:

To gain an acquaintance with the gospels, their background, content, interpretation, and criticism, in order that we may more effectively minister the Good News to this generation.



New Testament Survey

Because there have been a number of New Testament Survey courses written by excellent authors, we are taking a fresh approach. It will be our goal to see the Kingdom throughout this survey of the New Testament. Some of the things we will study will look the same, and may even use some of the same information as the other courses. It is our objective to make clear the Kingdom message as it began to be built by Jesus, was continued by the apostles, and as it culminates in the Book of the Revelation of Jesus Christ

Navigating Truth in End-Time Prophecy

This series of teaching will examine the accuracy of Biblical prophecy as demonstrated in the past, realized in the present and assured for the future. Drawing from the reliability of the Bible in the past and present prophetic fulfillment we will explore current events that affect our world in general and our personal lives in particular.

We will answer the critics concerning our past, present and future. We will discover that God is and always has been intimately involved with His creation and furthermore has a marvelous destiny for those who love, serve and trust Him.

We will wed eschatology with God's purpose for our lives now and into the future. We will explore social, spiritual political and economic trends in light of God's prophetic Word.

Old Testament Survey

Dr. Herbert Sutherland

This is a study of the early history of the nation of Israel, its special covenant relationship with God and his design to bring salvation to mankind through the seed of Abraham. Genesis 12:3 - I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you.

It highlights the laws of God for Israel, and also examines the order of classification of the Old Testament books: Pentateuch, Historical books, Poetic books, Major Prophets and Minor Prophets.

Course Objectives, this course aims to:

- A. Increase our understanding and appreciation of Old Testament History.
- B. Examine the contributions of various individuals and groups in the establishment of the nation of Israel.
- C. Explain the unifying theme of the Old Testament – God's covenant promises to Abraham and his descendants.
- D. Apply the knowledge of the Old Testament to daily living.



Pauline Epistles: Paul's Letters

This course will explore the thirteen letters of the New Testament written by the apostle Paul. These letters fall into two categories: four pastoral letters written to individuals (1 and 2 Timothy, Titus and Philemon) and nine letters written to churches (Romans to 2 Thessalonians). Emphasized is the contribution of each book's content to Christian Doctrine along with themes common in all letters. This includes the kingdom of God, the gospel, the person and work of Jesus Christ and practical Christian living.

Praying Like Jesus

The disciples in hearing and noticing the passionate and effective prayer life of Jesus said to Him: "Lord, teach us how to pray." They noticed that when He prayed, He came from the presence of His Heavenly Father with renewed grace, power and glory. In this teaching, you will be taught, trained and coached in passionate and intentional prayer like Jesus. You will learn how to touch the heart of God for unlimited favor and blessings. With strengthened power, you will "rule your world" and be intentional with your prayers, time and activities. Be refreshed and be refueled in the Presence of your King as you "Pray Like Jesus", your Heavenly Father using the template of Jesus who is hearing and praying

Principles of Prophecy

God speaks... God speaks to us ... God speaks through us. He is the Master Communicator. He delights to speak to us and through us so that others can benefit from "hearing" His heart. You are a candidate for both and He will be taking you into greater participation with Him. He is calling us to partner with Him as we host the operative Presence of God.

Prophetic Intercession

Our goal: For individual believers to grow in effective intercession by learning and applying the "tool" of the prophetic gift and the use of scripture in our prayer life. The potential for this is not only an increase in the quantity of prayer within our church family but also the increased effectiveness and thus the increase of answered prayer.

This participation with the Spirit in prayer brings glory to the Lord! Our challenge: "When the Church finds her knees, I will bring her enemies to their knees!" So much is intended in that picture! The people of God (you and me) are being reconnected to the very throne of God via our worship and intercession. From that throne will flow the power of our Exalted One! Our enemies (those forces which have contended fiercely against us) will be subdued.

And, there is coming a great wave of saving power from the Name of Him who is seated on that throne. Every knee must bow! Before that ultimate day declared in Philippians 2:9-11, it is the longing of our hearts and the longing of our Redeemer God. to see our loved ones (even resistive ones) begin



to bow in surrender to the Savior. Even nations and people's groups which have been thought to be "unbendable" are being drawn to join into the worship of our precious Jesus, the Lamb Who was slain. Our worship releases His response of power! (Rev. 5:9-13) Intimacy and majesty are about to merge! You can see His glory best when you are on your knees!

Tabernacle of Moses

When God brought Israel out of Egypt there was a prophetic statement made during the rejoicing on the edge of the Red Sea. This prophetic song of Moses was delivered in the midst of deliverance and celebration and is recorded in: Exodus 15:2 "The LORD is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation: he is my God, and I will prepare him a habitation; my father's God, and I will exalt him" In our study we will touch the edges of what is a profound subject, laying out guidelines for the interpretation of types and shadows and laying out areas of truths that run deep in the Word of God. The types and shadows of the Tabernacle are perfect and point to perfect truth. It is God that called it an "example and shadow of heavenly things", therefore in this course we will look into the heavenly things using the Tabernacle as our template.

Theology of Prayer

In this course it is our desire to take the pattern of the prayer life of Jesus, expanding them with other illustrations from the scriptures to show us how to pray effectively. It is to be remembered that His prayer life was not exercised as the Son of God, but as the Son of man. It was as the Son of man that prevailed in prayer thereby seeing the will of God manifested on earth.

Because Jesus is the pattern, both the pattern Son of God and pattern son of man, using His life for a basis to teach prayer is valid and imperative.

You will find that much of his prayer life is hidden, not being shown the gospels, but scattered throughout the rest of the scripture. Because David was a man after God's own heart, we often find the heart cry of the Son of Man, hidden in the prophetic vision of David during the crisis moments. In the book of Ezekiel we find the term often used, Son of Man. Because of this we will examine Ezekiel's conversations and cries to God/ Hidden in the prayer of Jeremiah, in the book of Lamentations are some more prophetic insights into the prayer life of Jesus.

With brief stops in the lives of other men and women of God, we will endeavour to show the prayer strategy of the Lord. It is our prayer that, as we journey through His prayer, showing the value of prayer and the practicality, we will learn how to build a prayer life.



The Book of Acts

Dr. Herbert Sutherland

The Book of Acts will explore the seeds of Church history. The Acts of the Holy Spirit through the Apostles and the impact on the then known world, will be emphasized. We will also study the gospel as communicated by Peter and Paul and how this impacted the kingdom of God. Upon completion of this study, the student will have a comprehensive understanding of the book of Acts.

The Book of Deuteronomy

Dr. Herbert Sutherland

This study corrects many of the misconceptions we have about God's love for us and what He really requires of us when He ask us to Love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul and intellect (Deuteronomy 6:5, Matthew 22:37).

This course will equip you with the tools required to identify and appreciate the evidence of God's love in every area of your life. It will also prepare you to demonstrate in a practical way His love; to all you come in contact with, whether you are at home, on the job at school, in the mall or at church (Deuteronomy 30:20).

As you meditate on the contents of this book you will be filled with more gratitude to God as you come face to face with the abundance of evidence in your life that He really loves you. (John 3:16, Romans 8:32).

The Book of Ephesians

Pastor Everett Flight

This course, "The Book of Ephesians," delves into Paul's profound letter to the church in Ephesus, unveiling transformative truths for believers. The overarching theme is transformation - moving from an old lifestyle to a new one in Christ, primarily explored in Chapters 1-3.

The specific theme is redemption and lift - being redeemed by God's grace and then elevated in Christ, understanding our high calling and how to live out this new identity. Chapters 4-6 address this concept of the "lift."

The course will examine how this change manifests in a culture often opposed to believers, providing practical application for today's world. We will explore core theological concepts such as our identity in Christ, the authority of God's Word, the mystery of the church, and how believers are left as "salt and light" in the world to be a witness for Christ.

The Book of John

"Jesus is the Christ! Believe and live" Warren Weirsbe. Some scholars refer to the Gospel of John as the most profound book in the New Testament.

In this Course you will see God's love in action through Jesus Christ and grasp a deeper understanding of the Word that became flesh and is still dwelling among us.



This Word is riveted inside each Christian for the manifestation of His Glory. Jesus is the Word! The power in His words caused people to listen; wherever He went, the results of His action and His influence compelled people to follow and when He turned up on the scene, hearts and lives were transformed.

He was both man and God. He is touched with compassion at your pains and struggles of everyday life because He has already paid the price. Allow His humanity to move you as he delights in your joys and allow His deity to catapult you to the life He has planned for you!

The Book of Jonah: God's Compassion for the Nations

The Book of Jonah is as relevant today as it was in the period it was written (800 – 750 BC). It speaks of the same God of Moses that was not only compassionate to Israel but he was the God of the Gentiles compassionate to all nations.

Jonah spoke to God's grace and compassion versus judgement. Today, God's grace versus judgement is still extended to nations just as he did with the people and city of Nineveh.

As we look at the spate of the world with wickedness, abomination and corruption as a great stench before a Holy God - he is calling us as his prophets and voice to the Nations to call them back to Repentance and to the ways of God so that he can relent and show compassion and mercy versus judgement as he had to do in the days of Noah or the days of Sodom and Gomorrah.

The Call is to you and me to be the voice of God in our Nations. Do not flee or be silent because God's word must come through and his Great commission stands

Jonah's prophecy and warning to Nineveh is the same for our Nations today so as you read through these pages hear and obey the instructions from God:

Today, God is calling each of us to avert Global disaster by being witnesses of his CHAYIL Glory and calling Nations to repent and return to God their first love.

The Book of Joshua: Possessing the Land

A study of "The Book of Joshua will reveal extraordinary miracles, battles, victories and new beginnings. Today, the God of Joshua is with His people through Christ Jesus. We are His army now and we too can go forward and possess all the promises He has already laid down for us. Like Joshua, our part is to be strong, very courageous and obedient.

God's commitment is that He will ensure nothing nor anyone can stand against us all the days of our lives. In addition, He will never leave us nor forsake us. It is time for all of us to rise up as His Harvesters to take back souls, land, resources for His Kingdom and to bring Him Glory! You have been prepared and equipped for success! Deuteronomy 20:17 "Completely destroy them—the Hittites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites" Together, let us turn the pages of this great book and discover the amazing strategies and directions God gave Joshua to ensure his victory in all the battles. We too can apply them today and claim the promised harvest of souls, land and resources through Christ Jesus to bring Him Glory!

The Book of Judges

Judges, The Unveiling of the Evangelist treats each character in the light of his ministry and its results. The parallels are drawn between the judges and the Evangelist with abundant illustration in this book. Lessons concerning attitudes, pitfalls, anointing, and results are studied to help ministry today avoid the problems seen in the book. The blessings and danger of itinerant ministry are spoken to as well.

The Book of Mark

The book of Mark is an exciting narrative of dynamic movement presenting Jesus in action rather than speaking. It is directed to the Gentile World giving a portrait of Jesus as the powerful Son of God whose word is law in the natural as well as in the supernatural realm. The paradox is that this strong Son of God who is King in the Kingdom of God is also the Servant of man, Saviour and Redeemer.

The Book of Mathew: Christ the King

The Gospel of Matthew presents “Christ the King” and “Savior of the World” who came to fulfill the law of the prophets and the Kingdom mandate for his followers. In this course, you will be taken on a journey with Matthew from the genealogy and lineage born of the Son of David and Son of Abraham to the Glorious birth of Christ and the Obedient and Victorious life he lived on earth through his baptism, messages and miracles which point to the inescapable conclusion that Christ is King!

From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” Matthew 4:17 While on earth, Jesus established and demonstrated the kingdom mandate, protocol and principles for us to live by as his kingdom citizens until he returns in the second coming with power and great glory to establish his kingdom on earth as it is in heaven and where he will reign as KING of KINGS and LORD of LORDS! Jesus Christ as King assures us his followers that he has given us all authority and power and commands us in (Matthew 28:19-20). “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen”

The Book of Romans

The idiom “Rome wasn’t built in a day” is an expression that is a plea for someone to be patient. Ironically, it takes patience to grasp the wealth of information that Paul, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, has written in the book of Romans. In this course we will examine the reasons Paul wrote this letter. They include a great desire to visit the church at Rome, the universality of the gospel, and the doctrine of justification by faith alone. We will also analyze critical and valuable theological issues as specified in the text of the book and apply these truths to our Christian life.



The Book of Ruth

Dr. Innes Howe

A study of "The Book of Ruth" will reveal it is not only a story about an exchange of love, loyalty and liberation between Naomi, Ruth and Boaz; but it will show you how God, will meet you where you are today as your Kinsman Redeemer; transform your circumstances and catapult you into a position to fulfill your destiny and His purpose for your life."

Eclipsed in the passages of this book is God's love for us; His desire for us to be His bride and His teaching on how we may prepare for that special day.

The Books of Wisdom

Dr. Herbert Sutherland

During our study of the books of wisdom, we will find that there is much direct and oblique reference to the Kingdom. The writers of the wisdom literature in the scriptures were prophetic people and, as is the case with Job, their lives were also prophetic all pointing toward the Kingdom to come.

David is a king/priest in training. Solomon is the king/priest who is reigning. He is also a type of one who allows himself to be lead astray, thus showing us what can keep us from the fullness of God's desire for us in the Kingdom.

The Psalms show to us the inner reactions to the dealings of God while going through the training. Another name for proverbs is parables thereby showing us a whole dimension of the prophetic that has not been explored until now.

Ecclesiastes shows us the dealings of God in the return of a backslider. Song of Songs describes for us the wooing of the Lord bringing us into mature intimate relationship with Himself and the place of laboring together with Him.

Each of these will be treated in the light of God's purpose from the beginning to bring His Kingdom to earth and how each instructs and guides us into a place of maturing of the Kingdom within, so the Kingdom can be manifest in a people in the earth.

Together we will find insights into the Kingdom in unexpected places as we search this portion of the scriptures together.

The Fruit of the Spirit

Apostle Paul writes in the Book of Galatians about the nine fruit of the Spirit. The Fruit of the Spirit is described by nine attributes: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control. Against such things there is no law." Galatians 5:22. In this course you will be inspired to grow in the fruit of the Spirit in fulfillment of the promises of God that the Earth will be filled with knowledge and manifested glory of the Lord. You are made in the image and likeness of God to manifest His nature and fruit in our world.



The Pentateuch

In this overview of the Pentateuch, we find God setting the stage for the understanding of his Kingdom.

In Genesis, the cornerstone of the Word of God, God's plan is seen. The seed of every truth is sown in Genesis and we will discover and reference each one. Although we will not have time to expand on them, the foundation of each will be laid in the types and shadows of creation and the history recorded in this book.

In Exodus, God's calling of a corporate body, known as the nation is Israel will show us the ways of God in dealing with a people to bring them to be His people knowing His ways.

In Leviticus, God's calling of priesthood and the principles of the priesthood of the believer are hidden as He prepares a corporate people to be king – priests.

In Numbers God develops the types and shadows that illustrate for us further development of the people of God and prophetic warnings by illustration, of the pitfalls that try to undermine the work of God in individual lives and the corporate life of a body.

In Deuteronomy, God gathers all the truths adding to them prophetic insight speaking not only of natural Israel's development, but the spiritual parallels are drawn as God gets ready to teach a people how to possess the promises He has given.

Given these brief statements concerning each book, we see why it is important to study each one. Come study with us as we discover together, God's prophetic, illustrative, picture of what He desires as He prepares His end-time church for the manifestation of the Kingdom on the earth.

The Prophetic Psalmist

Prophecy and Palmistry have one particular thing in common. Both gifts function correctly because of the understanding the gift holder has on the Kingdom of God. The purpose of both of these gifts is to further reveal the Kingdom of God to His children.

Palmistry expresses the understanding of man toward God. Prophecy reveals the heart of God towards man. The two gifts working in harmony with each other become a powerful tool of communication between things earthly and heavenly.

Understanding of how these gifts work requires one to have a working knowledge of the Kingdom of God. It also requires an understanding of how God views man as well as how God desires man to view Him.



The Voice of God

This course follows the Voice of God from Genesis to Revelation chronicling its expression with each of the men and women God speaks to. All of these expressions are treated and broken down into today's language so that men and women can recognize when God speaks to them and respond. All of the principles of trying the voices we hear are presented so that when the course is finished, men and women are able to discern when they are hearing God's voice in the midst of all the other voices that speak today.

Transforming Nations

"Land is the common denominator for the Transformation of people, cities, and nations. This impacting seminar will enable us to see with new perspective what God is doing in the world today, and how to read the signs of the times.

We will cover our individual and corporate territorial responsibility, a world view for authentic transformation, the removal of defilement from the land and see how land is actually healed, along with the people, businesses, and cities that actually occupy that land!

We will learn how to access the Doorways of cities and nations and how to release a lasting Kingdom culture through informed intercession. These are the keys for genuine and lasting Revival!"

Understanding Spiritual Gifts

The great gift of your salvation includes the Holy Spirit Himself coming to live inside you with all His power, grace, favor, ability and gifts. Revelation of the gifts within you will give you new authority and prepare you for more effective service in the Kingdom of God. Spiritual gifts manifest God's grace and power through you for ministry in the local Church and in the workplace. Every Christian person has spiritual gifts. This course will bring a new awareness of your spiritual gifts and how they function.

Winning the Heart of the King

Esther won the heart of the King of Persia in the competitive environment of hundreds of beautiful Persian ladies. She was an orphan adopted by Mordecai, a Jew and enemy of the Persians and yet she won the favor of the King.
